4. CHIEF'S REPORT

A. Liaison Chief's Report

Administration

The Final Budget for FY 2023-24 has been prepared and will be available for Board action later in this meeting. The Budget reflects an increase in revenue-related IGT and GEMT funding, expenditures remain relatively static with increases in communications, and fuel and carryover balances in capital for ambulance build delays. We are anticipating another large PP GEMT transfer to draw down additional funds for services provided. The Fire Districts Association of California and SMFD Deputy Chief Ted Peterson, in particular, have been champions of these programs. Chief Tubbs stated there is a Cal Chiefs podcast available to the public to help explain these programs.

While the Covid Pandemic was declared over by the World Health Organization, we are seeing an uptick in new cases and new strains. As mentioned previously, the impacts of this will continue for years to come. We are better prepared following these events and will remain vigilant to whatever may be next.

The Admin and Ops Chiefs reviewed the 2021 Ambulance redeployment study. The results identified that 3 ambulances, rescue and the ability to place a fourth ambulance as needed is appropriate for SMEMPS. There were significant impacts to individual agencies and training, which are solvable. The annexation of the City of Mill Valley to Southern Marin Fire will also require the group to review and update, as necessary, the governing documents: JPA, Bylaws, Plan of Ops and Finance Policy.

Supply chain disruptions continue. We originally anticipated delivery of Medic 10 last fiscal year; October 2023 seems likely. We remain on solid footing with medical supplies with the exception of some pharmaceuticals; however, we are investigating opportunities to retain tighter controls on inventory and supply needs with newer technology.

B1515 EMS Battalion Chief Todd Overshiner Update September 2023:

- Summer focused on Fire Season with many of our SMEMPS Paramedics and EMTs supporting the Fires throughout the state. We also recently supported staffing the water team to support the extensive rains that came with Hurricane Hilary.
- Our EMS Education Team (Bridget Peterson, Todd Overshiner, Heather Price Fair, Jen Glazier and Dr. Mark Bason-Mitchell) has been working on building education for the winter and spring months, reviewing calls that our Paramedics ran, and continually working on supply chain issues from the Pfizer plant destroyed by a tornado earlier this year.
- EMS Monthly Education is ongoing. During the summer, SMEMPS outdoor traumarelated incidents trend up. The refresher training focuses on these call types.
 - o Topics include:
 - Pediatric Advanced Life Support and Advanced Cardiac Life Support refresher classes this summer.
 - Trauma Classes was a huge success in in all agencies and completed this spring.
 - Completed: Cardiac training in May
 - Completed: Trauma training in July

- Upcoming classes: Mandatory Reporting, Infectious control, CPR, and skills review
- New Para-tech Equipment and Air Bag rescue equipment are budgeted for this year for Rescue 9. This new compliment will add to our current rescue tools to assist in training on vehicle accidents and building collapses.
- Ambulance replacement update: M10 anticipated October 2023. Also working with Chief Pearce on replacing the Chassis on old Medic 4, which is in great shape.

EMS Specialist Jen Glazier

- Attended the EMS Section North Meeting on Thursday, July 20th.
- Working with Heather Price Fair on LP Modem issues on transmitting to Code-Stat
- Waiting on order for Stryker for replacement of 5 LP15's modems. The current ones installed are Titan II that are no longer serviceable and at "end of life." Once the modems come in. Glazier states she will be installing them on all LPs.
- Continued communication with Adam Wilson and EMS supply rep from BoundTree on needs, equipment, backorders, and narcotics.
- Implementing American Heart Association Enrollware system for CPR Instructors. This will make CPR rosters, certifications, and e-card distribution easier for the instructors.
- Coordinating service on AMB gurneys with Stryker. It seems that we have a few gurneys
 that are 13 years old, or older, with no service contacts. There may be further costly
 gurney maintenance in the future.
- Meetings to come in the next couples of months Annual EMS Instructor Update & CPR Instructor Meeting and EMS Equipment Meeting
